## I-READING COMPREHENSION (12 marks)

### A- THE TEXT

1) At the top of his addiction, Ryan Cleave had little time for his real life. "World of Warcraft", the video game, had crowded out everything: his wife, his children and his job as an English language professor in Edinburgh. Before classes or late at night while his family slept, he would squeeze in time at the computer. He would eat foods that **required** only one hand, leaving the other free to work the keyboard and mouse.

2) Living inside "WoW", "World of Warcraft", seemed preferable to the boredom of everyday life, especially when **it** involved fighting with his wife about how much time he spent on the computer. "Playing WoW makes me feel godlike," Ryan wrote, "I have absolute control and power. The real world makes me feel helpless - a crying child, a dead mobile phone battery - the smallest trouble in daily living feels disabling." His wife used one word to describe her feelings: "disgusted". She felt abandoned. "I couldn't believe that someone could choose a virtual family over a real one," she said.

3) Ryan's life began to fall apart. He realised that the teachers at university disliked him and wanted him gone. His kids hated him and his wife threatened to leave. Finally, he was convinced he had a serious problem. His self-examination pulled him back to reality. He went home and deleted the game from his computer. For the next week, he felt like an addict withdrawing from drugs. Staying away from WoW was difficult, but he did not reinstall the game. Rather, he worked on his professional life and was hired as an English language professor at a university in Florida, USA, where he became **game-free**.
