### I - READING COMPREHENSION (12 marks)

- 1. A sophisticated in-car computer could soon make it impossible for motorists to speed. The system detects the speed limit and automatically slows the car if it is being driven too quickly. It pinpoints a vehicle's exact location via satellite and accesses a database of every road's speed limit to determine how fast the vehicle should be travelling. The Intelligent Speed Adaption system (I.S.A) will be unveiled today as part of the largest ever pilot of its kind.
- However, critics last night claimed that it was further evidence of state interference. They
  say it undermines the motorists' freedom and claim it could hinder, rather than aid, road
  safety.
- 3. The trial is being carried out by Transport for London (T.f.L), which runs buses, trains, the underground and major roads in the capital. T.f.L says its specially-equipped fleet, including cars, a bus and a black taxi will take to the roads this summer. During a sixmonth trial they will evaluate the technology's impact on road safety. T.f.L believes it could cut accidents by around 10 %.
- 4. "This innovative technology could help any driver avoid the unnecessary penalties of creeping over the speed limit and at the same time will save lives" said Chris Lines, head of T.f.L's road safety unit. However, Andrew Howard, the A.A's head of road safety, said: "Drivers are divided in their views of I.S.A; some hate it, some want it. Many have questions that will be answered only by trials like those being carried out by T.f.L." Paul Biggs, of the Association of British Drivers believes the system "will stop drivers thinking." T.f.L. will reveal its findings in a report next year.
